OPPOSE Requires 5-year renewal of pistol license

OPPOSE Dealer Restriction Bill

OPPOSE Mandates design criteria to keep that average 5-year-old child from operating a firearm.

S2375 Padavan
OPPOSE complete bans of certain ammo types.

S627 OPPOSE	Robach Expansion CoBIS system.
S3597 OPPOSE	Krueger Requires a 3 hour safety course prior to receiving a pistol license – a civil right.
A3211A OPPOSE	Eddington Bans .50 caliber or larger firearm.
S725 OPPOSE	Johnson C This bill assumes that gun manufacturers are routinely making firearms that appear to be toys.
S4456 OPPOSE	Schneiderman Overly stringent regulation regarding the employees firearm dealers.
S3098 OPPOSE	Schneiderman Mandatory firearm storage requirements.
A6157 OPPOSE	Titone Expansion of Assault weapon definition and registration of commonly owned rifles, pistols and shotguns.
S4397 OPPOSE	Schneiderman Requires all semiautomatic pistols manufactured or sold contain micro-stamp technology.
A7574 OPPOSE	Hoyt Provides that collateral loan brokers shall store firearms in the same manner as gunsmiths and dealers in firearms are required to store them. Unnecessary bill, pawnshops engaged in the business of buying and selling firearms must be licensed same as a gun dealer and follow all rules and regulations governing gun stores.
A7575 OPPOSE	Lancman broadly expands offenses that would be included in "serious offenses" which would permanently ban the offender and undefined family members from possessing firearms.
